Imagine a participant enjoying the camp of their dreams. We are making it a reality with AdaptAbilities Inclusion Camps.

Inclusion camp allows participants to pick a camp of their choice within the community. They can select an activity they have a special interest in, such as rock climbing, or riding horses.

Once the participant selects and registers for camp, AdaptAbilities will provide a staff member to provide the one-on-one support they need to fully enjoy the experience.

Children's Ability Fund **Snoezelen Room**

This controlled multi-sensory environment creates a comfortable and appropriate space for individuals with disabilities. It is a quiet space, equipped with different sights, sounds and textures to both calm or stimulate our participants.



Edmonton Community Foundation Sensory Gym

Our Sensory Gym may look like a playground at first glance. But a closer look reveals state-of-the art equipment that supports active sensory play. Individuals with special needs benefit from playing with this equipment as it increases sensory regulation.

MEET EVAN: Budding Entrepreneur and Hearts in Action Participant

Evan faces significant difficulties with Tourette Syndrome, ADHD, Anxiety Disorder and OCD being a reality in his life. His mom was very concerned that he would have trouble making friends. So even before kindergarten, Evan started attending AdaptAbilities' Hearts in Action summer camp.

Evan's experience at HIA Summer Camps was transformative. He made friends, enjoyed field trips and fell in love with activities he wouldn't have been able to try otherwise. Evan's mom was very appreciative that he was supported by AdaptAbilities' camp staff, who were capable of recognizing his challenges and abilities.

She says, "By the end of the first summer, he showed dramatic improvements in his social skills and his ability to deal with overwhelming situations. The staff were able to recognize his diagnosis and separate that from the loving boy he really is."

Now, Evan is thirteen years old and is a budding entrepreneur and philanthropist. He has even started a home business called Shake It Off Design, selling gemstone bracelets. Evan donates a portion of his sales to Tourette Canada.
